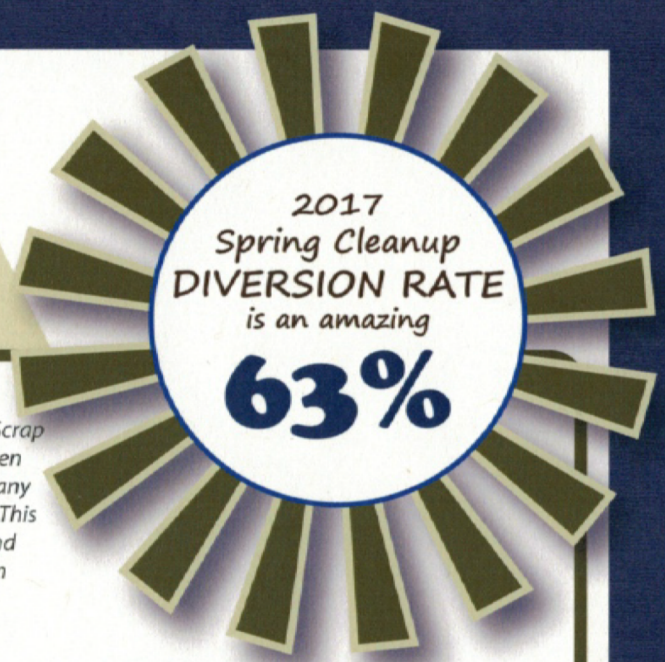
We CANNOT accept...

- Batteries



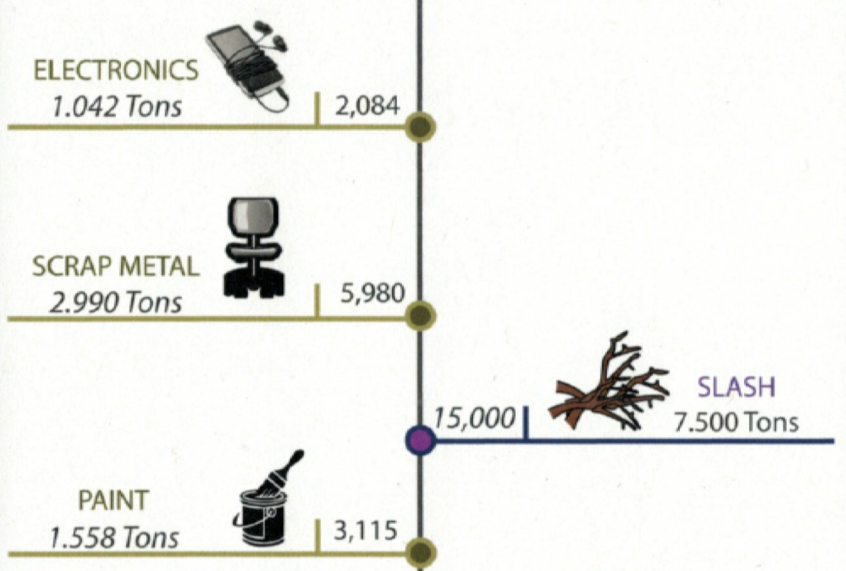

SCRAP METAL

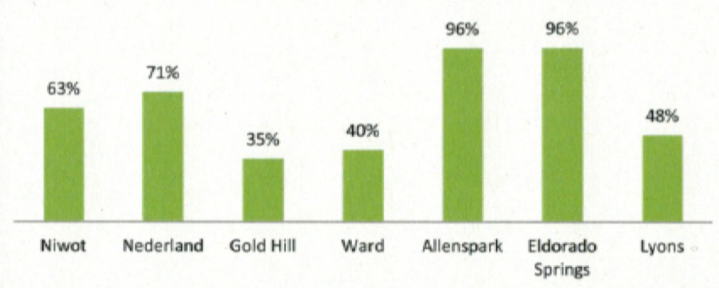
Niwot collected a lot of scrap metal. Scrap metal is a valuable commodity that when kept from the landfill can be recycled many times beyond its first intended purpose. This type of recycling saves a lot of energy and water, and saves greenhouse gases from being emitted into the atmosphere.

SLASH

Niwot collected over 6 tons of lumber and dimensional wood material. Though organic (living or once-living) material is legally accepted at Colorado landfills, it can actually be worse material to landfill than traditional trash. When organic material sits in a landfill it releases concentrated methane, which is a greenhouse gas 23 times more potent than CO2. By chipping and composting wood and dimensional lumber, Niwot was able to avoid additional greenhouse gases being emitted to the atmosphere.
